Renaissance Pleasure Faire (Reviewed by Danya Winterborn):

This is the great granddaddy of them all when it comes to Renaissance Faires. As Misty likes to say, "I'm older than dirt" because I attended this Faire back when it was in Agora, California in the incarnation that shows up in *Bedlam's Bard*. When developers took over the old site, it moved to Devore, California, which was okay but which lacked the charm of the Agora location (There was a bit too much concrete and permanent modern structures to my liking.). Now it is held in Irwindale, California, and I had the pleasure of visiting it with two of my children on Mother's Day.

First off, getting there is an extreme adventure. Although it really is "just minutes from Pasadena", the GPS in my car came up with nothing when I put in the address. Fortunately my eldest son had Waze on his iPhone and that got us to where the signs telling us where to go started. What the signs didn't say is where the line to get into the parking lot started, but we eventually figured out that the people backed up onto the highway weren't waiting for a train or traffic light. After we got passed the parking lot pay kiosk, we remembered that the new location is inside an old stone quarry. There was lots of driving around with HUGE piles of stones that people who apparently completely oblivious to how far they had to fall if they slipped on the path were jogging along. Reminded me a bit of the description of Vanyel and Stef trying to get to the pass in the Ice Wall Mountains!

Once parked, there was a bit of a hike to the main gates. This is not a Faire you want to attend with uncomfortable footwear, and if you have trouble walking, bring the wheel chair. At my age you appreciate the fact that the privies have definitely improved and are more abundant than they were in the early days of the Faire. Other than that, though, you really take a step back in time—as far as the Faire itself is concerned. The day we were there was a Costume Con, and people were a bit muddled as to the meaning of the word "Renaissance." We saw a whole bunch of Avengers, Star Wars characters, and other folk you'd expect to run into at ComiCon. Offsetting that, though, were some tremendously intricate, and often fanciful, outfits. My favorite was a guy dressed as a water nixie who seemed to have taken lessons from Andy Serkis when it came to his ability to move. He did his entire character without speaking, and his interactions with a toddler resulted in my daughter's photographer friend taking what seemed like a thousand pictures of him.

The show schedule is a bit difficult to read, but it's well worth spending a bit of time to puzzle it out. There is a wide variety of entertainment, from skits to demonstrations of activities in Renaissance life. My daughter ditched us early on to go watch falconers free-fly their raptors at one of the venues. The Joust was reminiscent of Medieval Times (though the sound system needed a bit of work). There's signage, and Faire workers are more than happy to give you directions, but I do miss the days when you were handed maps at the gate. Maybe I just got older, but the Faire seems to have grown at least two or three times the size it was when I was younger. Set up meeting points for your party at regular intervals because cell service can be a bit unreliable, depending on who your provider is.

The food is phenomenal and varied. There's a food court where you can obtain things that are a bit adventurous (quail, toad-in-the-hole, Steak on a Stake, funnel cake) and more familiar items to please any fussy eaters in your group (pizza, chicken). The iconic turkey legs are still served. The other really good thing that's developed over the years is that there are now food stalls spread throughout the Faire in case you get feeling puckish when you are some distance from the food court (or when the lines in the food court are excessively long).

The variety of vendors is positively mindboggling. Puzzle rings, corsets, candles, incense, staves, wands, pewter mugs, tiaras—and a few modern things like T-shirts—fill row after row. (Someone got the bright idea to stick ATMs behind screens at strategic places and most vendors take Lady Visa and Master Card.) You'll leave tired, broke, stuffed, and very, very happy. Oh, and remember the sunblock, or you'll also be nursing a sunburn for the better part of a week. (Guess how I know that  $\blacksquare$ .)

#### Meeting Misty

I am a Critical Role fan, there I said it, I LOVE to watch those nerdy ass voice actors play Dungeons and Dragons. Look here is the thing, they are fairly local, I mean I am in the OC. Geek and Sundry studios are located up in LA, so for them going to Wonder\*Con was an easy win. Loads of fans (they have over 25,000 subscribers, and 290,000 followers), Wonder\*Con, San Diego Comic\*Con's baby sister as it were, obliging gave them the big arena. They did not believe they were going to even half fill it. It wasn't only me, a couple guys from my D&D group were going to be there as well. I wanted to take my son to a Con before he goes off to college in the fall. I even called him out sick that Friday (I do the same for Blizz\*con, though we watch that from home because I am nowhere near quick enough to click for that ticket). So here we were with tickets for the whole weekend. I printed out the schedule because there were three days of events and with permanent nerve sciatic nerve damage having a plan on how to see as much of the con as possible while having lots of sitting down time is important.

I curled up on the sofa with a lap desk and grabbed a pen, and then started scanning through the list of various panels, and found.... special guest Mercedes Lackey, wait.....what....that can't be right.... I look again. Danya and I have been Co-Presidents of Queen's Own for 17 years....it has been a wish of mine since junior high when I was handed my first copy of Magic's Pawn to meet this beautiful writer. Beautiful in that she "saw" me, the invisible, the hoping to fit in and hide my queerness to fit in. And there there it was a character in a book, a character without fan fare, who was dealing with the same issues that I was. I think that was my favorite thing, the main character was matter of fact, not with a big flashy light, a character that falls in love with another man. She was going to be at the Con...I was going to be at the Con, she had 3 panels, and 2 signings! There was no way I was going to miss her! I screamed, in excitement I squee-ed. My son came bolting in the room to make sure I was okay, and when I shared what I had found he rolled his eyes and told me he knew where he could find me. I immediately circled all the panels and the first signing. Next I went to my bookcase and while I wanted to take all 80ish of my Mercedes Lackey books, I thought other people may want to get books signed so I looked through and found the three that meant the most to me. I carefully packed them away in our gear bag.

The first panel Misty was on was the "Sisters of the Self Sufficient" I thought this would be a great panel, as it reminded me of Kerowyn, Tarma and Kethry, Elsbeth and Savil. Misty did not shy from her strong female characters. Many of those on the panel had recently published their first books, or nearly their second, and Misty dead center piped up she had published 126 books. I do not own them all and while I have read more than I own I had not known there were quite that many. One of the first things that Misty mentioned is that she wasn't feeling very self-sufficient as one of her parrots had torn her cornea recently and she was effectively blind in her right eye. It was then I noticed Larry sitting quietly in the front row. She made mention of how great it was to have him lead her around. I loved that Misty having had been published so many times, was very down to earth, and encouraging to the younger writers on the panel.



After the panel had finished I rushed to the next panel, "Fantasy: Not Always Fantastic." This panel Misty and Larry were both discussing the topic, "life in a magical fantasy world-epic, urban, or otherwise-comes with its own kinds of challenges and conflicts." In this panel I learned about how much Larry's writing and Misty's influences each other, and I got to see them really together and really they reminded me of my favorite aunt and uncle. Part of my weird little family/tribe, and made me feel so welcome. The panel moderator was late and they let people start lining up to get books signed on the spot. They offered to let you call a friend and chat at them for a minute or two. I think they signed for about 15 people before the moderator got there and they started discussing the panel topic. The panel revolved around the fact that sometimes having magic in a situation just made it worse. That there is always a cost to having the magic, weather it be attracting bigger villains, or going awry, think of the first things Companions do when they Bond? They lock down their partners until they learn to control their Gifts (mind magic).



Shortly after the panel there was a signing for the panel authors, down in Hall A, so my son and I meandered down there and lined up for signatures. I had brought: Magic's Pawn, By the Sword and the Black Gryphon, the books that had the biggest influences for me. There were some people that found books to buy on the spot and Misty and Larry had a limited number of the SERRAted Edge novels to give away so fans would have something to sign. This was a big bucket list moment for me, I have loved their books for so long, and while I really wanted to meet them I wasn't sure I ever would get a chance. The line seemed to take forever before I was in front of them. And I learned why the line was going so slow. First they want to meet you, and much to my delight....they knew who I was...I mean..I introduced myself as Kendra, but also healermoon, and they knew me from Queen's Own. This was the highlight of my trip for sure.

Immediately, you are embraced in their warm welcoming aura. You are their whole world and it doesn't matter that there are 15 people behind you in line. At their panels you feel as if your question is the only one that matters at the time. Even though you can tell they were tired from travel and con circuit. When fans speak to them it melts away. The synergy of them as a couple is beautiful, and you can see the love between them and can't imagine they would function well apart. I loved that. Let me say that again... I LOVED that.

And when I spoke with them as they were signing my books and mentioned who I was they gave me lots of stuff for club giveaways, contests to be announced. Lots of signed stuff.



The next day was an all about Misty and Larry panel in which they were just open to questions. Larry pointed me out and asked me to introduce myself and talk a little about the club. We were able to ask her about characters that were meant to be pass through characters but ended up to be a main character, and they looked at each other and said, Firesong. I asked if they had any new Valdemar books coming out and the answer is yes, a new Valdemar novel, with Firesong is in the works. I learned Misty works from an outline, which helps keep her on track and she said the key to being an author is that you have to treat it like a job, you have to sit and write your 8 hours a day. Larry generally does first pass edits/read through, and that helps keep her on track as well. As for the newer books they are coming out with the various Ebooks types. However the older books are still not currently available with Ebook and unfortunately she doesn't know when they will be released in ebook form. She is happy that fan fiction is written however she will not ever read it as she doesn't want any fans feeling she is taking their ideas.

After the Misty and Larry panel I did make it to the arena to watch the Critical Role panel, and it was awesome. However, my heart was still a glow from my Meeting Misty moment, I thought would never happen.
